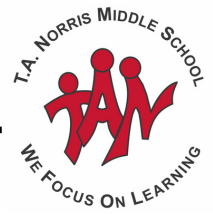

Principal's Corner

This year, Edmonton, Alberta, proudly hosted the Canada-Wide Science Fair (CWSF), one of the country's most prestigious and inspiring celebrations of youth innovation, scientific inquiry, and creativity. Since its inception in 1962, the Canada-Wide Science Fair has brought together some of the brightest young minds from across the nation to share research, explore new ideas, and collaborate on solutions to real-world challenges. Each year, thousands of students participate in regional fairs with only the top projects advancing to the national stage, making participation in CWSF an extraordinary accomplishment.

The fair continues to grow in impact and reputation, highlighting the incredible potential of Canadian students in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Beyond competition, the event encourages collaboration, critical thinking, innovation, and a passion for lifelong learning.

We are incredibly proud to recognize the involvement of our very own Harris Doucette from Grade 8 French Immersion, who has dedicated significant time and effort to researching and developing an innovative prototype paint that uses biomimetic materials to reduce radiation exposure during space exploration and future space habitation. Harris will be presenting this remarkable project at the Canada-Wide Science Fair, showcasing not only scientific creativity and problem-solving skills but also a commitment to exploring solutions with meaningful real-world applications for astronaut safety and long-term living in space environments.

Harris's approach to radiation mitigation involves a sophisticated three-layer radiation-shielding system. The first layer consists of a Melanin Radiation Absorber combined with a carbon binder to help absorb harmful radiation. The second layer is a hydrogen-rich hydrogel layer designed to further reduce radiation penetration. The third layer is a reflective outer shield that uses Y-Shield technology and specialized paint coatings to help deflect additional radiation. This innovative multi-layer design demonstrates an impressive understanding of biomimicry, material science, and space engineering concepts at an early stage of scientific research.

This achievement is a testament to Harris's curiosity, perseverance, and dedication to scientific exploration. Representing our school community at a national event of this calibre is an outstanding accomplishment, and we are excited to see Harris share this innovative work with students, educators, scientists, and industry leaders from across Canada.

Congratulations, Harris, on this incredible opportunity and achievement. We are immensely proud of your hard work, innovation, and leadership in science.

OUR COMMITMENT TO STUDENT & STAFF SAFETY

Earlier this month, the Peace River School Division became aware of a potentially threatening post on social media. Working closely with the RCMP, we received assurances from them that there was no imminent threat to student or staff safety. Schools remained open throughout, and the matter was quickly resolved without incident. While the outcome was fortunate, it was a serious and valuable opportunity to review and strengthen our safety practices.

The tragic events in Tumbler Ridge in February of this year reminded all of us that complacency is not an option. That situation shook loose any sense that these things happen elsewhere, but not here, and that awareness has sharpened our resolve.

I want to be clear about something important: we would never open schools or mobilize buses to transport children to a site that we believed was unsafe. When schools are open, it is because we, in close partnership with the RCMP and neighbouring school divisions, have information that confirms there is no imminent risk. If that assessment were ever to change, our decision would also immediately change.

During the recent incident, some of the anxiety in our community was amplified by information circulating on social media that was not accurate. Locked front doors were mistaken for a lockdown. Open schools were seen as a sign something was being ignored. I understand why misinformation spreads quickly in moments of uncertainty, and we are committed to improving how quickly and clearly we communicate with families during these situations so that the facts reach you before fear does.

A NOTE ON LOCKED DOORS

Locked doors at PRSD schools are not a sign of alarm, they are a sign of diligence. The days of walking freely into a school and heading down the hallway are behind us, and for good reason. All visitors now buzz in, identify themselves, and state their purpose before entering. This is a standard of care we apply every single day, not just during incidents. If you arrive at a school and find the door locked, please know that you are witnessing our safety culture in action.

At the provincial level, work is underway to establish minimum school security standards across Alberta. We have already submitted our safety plans to government as part of that process and accessed funding to upgrade access control technology in our schools. Once provincial standards are finalized, we will review our practices against them and adjust wherever needed, though we are confident we are already in a strong position.

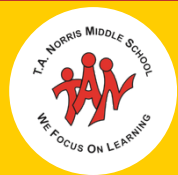
To families who reached out with questions and concerns following the recent incident: thank you. Your engagement matters. We want you informed and confident. We will always protect the privacy of individuals involved in any situation, as we are required to by law, but we will never leave you wondering whether we are taking your child's safety seriously.

We hope we never face a real active threat in our Division. But we prepare as though one could come tomorrow. Our protocols exist precisely so that the people who carry them out can act decisively and calmly when it matters most. That preparedness is our promise to every family in Peace River School Division.
